Terms of Membership

Responsibility.

- Who is responsible for the club, its members and the range?
- Who is responsible for your firearms license?
- Who is responsible for your firearms?

- As a member of the Rifleman Firearms Target Shooting Club your name, address, date of birth and other personal details relevant to your membership will be kept securely and only used for club membership purposes.

- Each time you shoot at the club, you will be required to present your license (no copies) and detail the make, model, serial number and caliber of each firearm you are shooting.
- If you are awaiting a variation to, or re-newel of your firearms license (F.A.C) you must inform us prior to your range booking to receive approval to shoot. Do not expect us to jeopardize the business, the club & our jobs for your negligence.

- We are obliged to notify your police licensing authority if you cease to be a member of Rifleman firearms target shooting club.

- You must shoot at the club the **minimum** required amount of 6 individual dates during your annual membership period.
- Attending only 3,4 or 5 times could lead to your membership being terminated. A review of your reason/s will be submitted to the committee, a vote will be final.
- Attending less than 3 sessions during your annual membership will jeopardize Home office approval of our club, therefore you will not be offered a renewal to remain a member of Rifleman firearms target shooting club.

- If your membership is terminated, you will be notified and so will your Firearms constabulary if you have a firearms license. Or applying for one.
- If you pay monthly via direct debit, we will cancel the monthly payments.
- It is **your** responsibility, if in doubt call us to check your attendance.

Range Rules & Safety Regulations

- Before arrival, all firearms must be made “clear & safe” by removing the bolt, and all firearms must be unloaded and have detachable magazines removed.
- Your firearms must remain in a slip or hard case until in position at an allocated shooting bench.
- The muzzle must be pointing down range, whilst the firearm is unpacked.

- An E.C.I (empty chamber indicator) breech flag or chamber flag must be inserted whenever your firearm is left unattended.
- The bolt must remain open whenever your firearm is not in use.
- Lever action rifles & revolvers must be left “open” when not in use.

- **Club rifles** must remain on the bench “clear & safe” at the end of a session. The range officer will return it to the armory.
- You are required to clean your bench and sweep up any used cases **within** your allocated time slot.
- You are required to fill in the ammunition count register each time you use the range.

- Ear defenders must always be worn inside the range.
- Eye protection must always be worn when using a semi-automatic firearm.
- Do not leave equipment/accessories outside of your booth that others may trip on.
- Inform reception before your booking commences if you wish to shoot prone.

- Target placement is very important, and you may be liable for repair/replacement for unnecessary negligent damage to the target system or structure.
- Placement of your target should be at optic level, check the trajectory should a round go through the target.
- If you are unsure, please ask a range staff to place your target.

Do not pull the trigger if you do not know where the bullet will strike.

- The following amendments to the club terms & conditions are for the safety of yourself, other range users and to avoid negligent damage to the range/ range equipment.
- All additional cost is at a minimum and we hope you appreciate the value of the additional training that is actually priceless!

- If you are unsure how to bore-sight your rifle when zeroing a scope, you must book assistance/training in **advance.**
- Please remember the staff at the range are not working for your club, the range is a business and once you are a full member, all assistance is chargeable.
- This will be far cheaper than replacing any damages or placing your membership in jeopardy.

- When using a rifle with open sights, use your due diligence.
- Start at 25 yards, if you are not grouping well do not shoot further away until you are competent to do so.
- When buying a semi-automatic .22 rifle, a long-barrelled pistol or long-barrelled revolver for the **first** time, you will need to book a “safety training session” with the range staff before we allow you to use your firearm un-supervised. Free of charge in your probationary period and free if you purchase the firearm from Rifleman firearms or Rifleman Tactical.

Misfire Procedure

- You must remain in position pointing the muzzle down range at the bullet trap for a minimum of 30 seconds.
- If possible, remove your magazine & pre-loaded ammunition, while supporting the rifle and remain mindful the rifle could still go off.
- Keeping your hands and face away from the extraction port attempt to eject the round.
- If the round ejects, inspect to remedy its fault.
- If you have any concerns, check the bore and call it “clear & safe” to continue.
- If possible, re-chamber and fire a second time.
- If a second miss-fire occurs, eject again and place in the allocated red “duds” case.
- When the round does not eject, remove your bolt and inspect the extractors making sure they are clean and functional.
- Whilst always maintaining a safe muzzle direction, re-insert the bolt and push extractors onto the case, repeat if necessary to remove the jammed round.
- If the above process is unsuccessful, please inform the range officer.
- There are many reasons for a miss fire, please find time to understand the causes and how to avoid them.
- It is **your** responsibility to respect & maintain your firearms, please ask for advice and assistance if you are unsure.
